## **Charter Schools Bill**

A4PEP has been advising State Representative Lorena Garcia on her bill to address the need for improved accountability and transparency in charter schools. This bill will probably be introduced by the end of February. The bill includes provisions to deal with the following issues of concern with charter schools:

- Budget transparency
- Waivers from state law, such as reporting on educator effectiveness
- Provision of and paying for services for students with special needs
- Conflicts of interest of charter school leaders
- Impacts of charter schools on districts with declining enrollment
